Track Questions

Q: Where is the track located?

A: The Las Vegas Strip Circuit™ is a street circuit and the track is located on S. Las Vegas Boulevard as well as Harmon Avenue, Koval Lane and Sands Avenue.

Q: Where is the start/finish line?

A: The start line will be located at the site of the brand-new Las Vegas Grand Prix Pit Building located on the corner of Harmon Avenue and Koval Lane.

Q: How long is the track?

A: The circuit is 3.8 miles long with 17 corners, three straights and two drag reduction system (DRS) zones.

Q: Will there be barriers around the track?

A: Yes, there will be barriers on both sides of the 3.8-mile circuit. The concrete barriers will be about 3-feet tall, and the debris catch fence on top will be about 12-feet tall.

Q: Will you be able to watch the race from the sidewalk?

A: Sidewalks along Las Vegas Boulevard will still be open to the public during race weekend; however, they will not have views of the track/race from the public walkways.

Q: What is the event schedule?

The FORMULA 1 HEINEKEN SILVER LAS VEGAS GRAND PRIX will take place November 16-18, 2023. For the full event schedule, visit www.f1lasvegasgp.com.

Track Paving & Construction Questions

Q: When will the roads be impacted due to paving?

A: Paving is on track for completion in early October. For the latest details on the traffic plans and road closures, visit Clark County's Resort Corridor Projects page at www.resortcorridor.com.

Q: When are the track barriers being installed?

A: The barrier installation will begin in October with a phased approach. During that time, there will be rolling lane closures as the concrete blocks are placed. Q: When will the track lighting structures be installed?

A: The temporary track lighting installation will begin in September with a phased approach. During that time, there will be rolling lane closures as the lighting structures are placed. Vehicle Bridges

Q: Where are the temporary vehicle bridges being installed?

A: There will be three temporary vehicular bridges placed along the city's resort corridor to make transportation as seamless as possible before and during the race. The Flamingo vehicular bridge will be located on E. Flamingo Road crossing Koval Lane. The Audrie vehicular bridge will be located on Audrie Street crossing E. Harmon Ave. The Top Golf vehicular bridge will also cross E Harmon Ave.

Q: What is the timeline for the temporary bridges being installed?

A: The Topgolf vehicular bridge will be installed Sept. 19 - 21 and Oct. 26-Nov. 3. The Audrie vehicular bridge will be installed Sept. 22 - Oct. 5. The Flamingo vehicular bridge will be installed Oct. 15-25. Q: How many vehicle lanes will the bridge on E. Flamingo Road accommodate?

A: The bridge will have a total of four lanes - two lanes eastbound and two lanes westbound.

Q: Will these bridges be able to accommodate larger vehicles?

A: The temporary vehicular bridges are highway-rated and can accommodate a variety of vehicles, including fire engines and tractor trailers, buses and ambulances.

Q: Can the public use the vehicular bridges?

A: Once the vehicular bridges are installed, the public will be able to use the Flamingo and Audrie vehicular bridges. No public access will be available to the Topgolf vehicular bridge before, during or after the event.

Access to the Flamingo and Audrie vehicular bridges will be limited while the track is "hot" during the event days. During hot track hours, access will be available to a mixture of authorized vehicles and resort guests with the proper credentials. Note, there will be multiple checkpoints leading to the bridges.

Hot Track Road Closures

Q: When will roads be closed for the race?

A: During race weekend (Nov. 16-18), the roads will begin to close at 5 p.m. each day, with a full closure at 7 p.m. Roads will reopen at 2 a.m. following race activity each day. When the event is not taking place, Las Vegas Boulevard and the surrounding circuit streets will be open to traffic.

The temporary full road closures will take place at the following streets:

- Sands Avenue between S. Las Vegas Boulevard and Howard Hughes Parkway
- Harmon Avenue between S. Las Vegas Boulevard and Lamar Circle
- Koval Lane between Sands Avenue and East Tompkins Avenue
- S. Las Vegas Boulevard between Genting Boulevard and W. Ariz Place
- E. Flamingo Road between Via Del Nord and Linq Lane
- Spring Mountain Road between Mel Torme Way and S. Las Vegas Boulevard

Q: How early do we need to get to The Strip to avoid road closures?

A: During race week, Thursday Nov. 16 - Saturday, Nov. 18 the roads will begin to close at 5 p.m. each day, with a full closure at 7 p.m. It is recommended to travel to The Strip before 5 p.m. to avoid traffic shifts and delays.

Q: When will roads be open again?

A: Roads will reopen at 2 a.m. following race activity each day. Vehicles will be able to access the public roads as the track barriers begin to reopen.

Q: How will road closures affect public transportation?

A: The RTC will have various closures and detour routes in the area. We will work closely to make sure that the public is notified of all closures and detours well in advance so riders can plan accordingly. As soon as this information is finalized, we will be sure to share.

Pedestrian Walkways and Sidewalks

Q: Will new pedestrian bridges be constructed?

A: Three temporary pedestrian bridges will be installed across the circuit. One will be located adjacent to the Flamingo Road vehicular bridge, one in the Sphere Zone and one crossing on Rochelle Avenue to/from the Koval Zone to the East Harmon Zone. The Sphere Zone and Rochelle Avenue Bridge will be for ticketed guests only.

Q: Will existing pedestrian bridges be accessible during the race?

A: Yes, existing pedestrian bridges will be accessible during the race. The existing bridges will be enclosed to ensure the safety of pedestrians and drivers on the track.

Q: What will the sidewalks around the track look like?

A: Most sidewalks along the circuit will still be open to the public during race weekend. There will be specific locations where pedestrian access will be re-routed due to safety.

Q: Will you be able to watch the race from the sidewalk?

A: Sidewalks along Las Vegas Boulevard will still be open to the public during race weekend; however, they will not have views of the track/race from the public walkways.

Q: Will there be maps situated along the pathways?

A: There will be QR codes that connect to the Las Vegas Grand Prix App, which will feature detailed maps and provide guests with directions to their designated fan zone. Guests will be able to create customized routes specific to their current location, end destination and real time road openings and closures. Additional details about the app will be shared later this month.

Q: Will there be security along the pathways helping guide foot traffic?

A: Yes, sidewalks will be monitored by Las Vegas Grand Prix security, ambassadors, and the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department to limit crowds and maintain a consistent flow of traffic. Las Vegas Grand Prix wayfinding personnel will be around the circuit to assist with directions as well as pre- and post-race ushering.

Transportation & Parking

Q: What is the best method of transportation to and from my seats/hotel?

A: Due to the road closures, we strongly encourage walking from the nearby hotels. The F1 Las Vegas App will provide fans with the best walking route to get from the hotel to their assigned zone/seat.

Q: Where can I park and walk to the event?

A: While the majority of the resort properties on The Strip will have available parking on-site, it is important to note that any resort located within the circuit will require a pass or reservation for entry. If you choose to drive, please take note of the traffic shifts, expect delays and consider alternative routes.

Q: If I live here in Las Vegas, how do I get to the track?

A: We highly recommend taking a rideshare service to one of the designated drop-off locations closest to your assigned zone. While most resort properties on The Strip will have available parking on-site, it's important to note that any resort located within the circuit will require a pass or proof of reservation (room, restaurant, show) for entry. If you choose to drive, please take note of the traffic shifts, expect delays and consider alternative routes.

Q: Can I park at any hotel or resort regardless of my ticket?

A: Yes. It's important to note that any resort located within the circuit will require a pass or proof of reservation (room, restaurant, show) for entry. If you choose to drive, please take note of the traffic shifts, expect delays and consider alternative routes. If you choose to park at a nearby resort property, please visit their respective websites to review their parking guidelines.

Q: Will I be able to Uber/Lyft and get dropped off in front of my zone?

A: There will be designated rideshare pick-up and drop-off locations at Virgin Hotels Las Vegas and The Hughes Center. From these drop-off points, it will be a short walk to the entry gates.

Q: Will the Monorail be running during the race?

A: Yes, the Monorail will be a convenient form of transportation. You can plan to hop on at the locations outside of the track and take the Monorail to the inside of the track.

Event Questions

Q: What are the dates of The FORMULA 1 HEINEKEN SILVER LAS VEGAS GRAND PRIX?

A: The FORMULA 1 HEINEKEN SILVER LAS VEGAS GRAND PRIX will take place on November 16-18, 2023. Select tickets include events on additional dates.

Q: How will I know where to go?

A: All ticketed guests will receive email communications with information specific to their ticketed zone. We encourage all guests to reference our website, download F1 Las Vegas App once available, and utilize our customized wayfinding map to their specific zone.

Q: Where will the entrance be for my assigned zone?

A: Details on zone entrances will be shared with ticketholders.

Q: How will Paddock Club™ guests get to and from the area?

A: Paddock Club™ guests can utilize a dedicated shuttle that will run continuously during these below hours of operation:

- Wednesday, November 15: TBD
- Thursday, November 16: 5:30 p.m. - 3 a.m. (next day)
- Friday, November 17: 5:30 p.m. - 3 a.m. (next day)
- Saturday, November 18: 4:30 p.m. - 2 a.m. (next day)

Guests with Paddock Club™ tickets can be picked up from the following locations: Aria Resort & Casino, Resorts World Las Vegas, Caesars Palace & Top Golf.

We encourage all guests and staff to download the Las Vegas Grand Prix App once live and use the map feature.

Paddock Club™ guests can enter via the main entrance off Koval Lane, where all shuttles will drop off. A secondary option would be to enter at the Harmon Avenue and Kishner Drive entrance. From there, guests will need to proceed to the tunnel and enter at the northeast side of Las Vegas Grand Prix Paddock Building.

Q: Will there be access for persons with disabilities?

A: The FORMULA 1 HEINEKENSILVER LAS VEGAS GRAND PRIX 2023 will be an inclusive and accessible event, and we are committed to ongoing efforts to provide access to the event facilities, amenities, and activities. Below, you will find details about the services offered. We kindly request that you carefully review the guidelines on the Las Vegas Grand Prix website at www.f1lasvegasprix.com/faqs.

Q: What will I not be allowed to bring to the event?

A: Prohibited items include: Animals (except for service animals), strollers, collapsible or non-collapsible chairs or stools, non-clear bags, professional film, photo or audio equipment, flags, banners, signs or promotional materials, and noisemakers, bells, whistles, megaphones, airhorns and vuvuzelas.

Any item that in the opinion of the promoter has the potential to cause injury to a person(s) or cause a public nuisance will be confiscated.

Q: What is the bag policy of the FORMULA 1 HEINEKEN SILVER LAS VEGAS GRAND PRIX 2023?

Clear plastic bags that do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12"
Small bags or fanny packs that do not exceed 4.5" x 6.5"
Diaper bags are permitted.
All bags are subject to search.

Q: What type of experiences will the fan zones offer guests when the race is not taking place? Are there any planned concerts or events?

A: Between races, attendees can enjoy their dedicated fan zone with F1 activations, live entertainment, food and drink stations and more.

Q: When will the fan zones open each day?

A: The fan zones will open at 6 p.m. on Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

Ticketing

Q: What types of tickets are available?

A: A variety of ticketing options are available, including grandstand seating and hospitality packages. For more details on ticket types, please visit the Las Vegas Grand Prix website.

Q: Are children allowed to attend the event?

A: Children are permitted to attend. Children under 24 months do not need a ticket to enter the Las Vegas Grand Prix, provided that they are seated on a parent or guardian's lap and do not interfere with the sightlines of others.

Q: Can I upgrade my ticket package after I have already purchased one?
